He is also a mayoral representative to the Civilian Complaint Review Board (CCRB), which exercises civilian oversight of the city's Police Department. He is a graduate of Greensboro College and earned his M.Div. from Yale University's Divinity School which has awarded him its Distinguished Alumnus Award for Community Service.

## **Mission Possible II in 2018**

It's a new year and the Mission Possible Phase II capital campaign is starting 2018 with a lot of momentum!

- Two of the four stages of our pipe organ's renovation are now complete. The final two stages of the renovation are scheduled for this year and will require temporary interruptions in organ service.
- The last of three new energy-efficient air handlers was installed in the balcony stairwell last week. Over the next two weeks the humidifiers that go (one each) on the three air handler units will be balanced. This will regulate the humidity in the Sanctuary, a critical factor affecting the organ's performance.
- The leaking skylight in the columbarium is scheduled to be replaced this year, and the new Landscape Ministry Team will hold its first meeting this month to begin planning for ways to make Foundry's outside more environmentally sustainable and aesthetically pleasing.
- So far, \$740 has been raised through the sale of watercolor notecards and prints designed and gifted by Foundry family member Sheldon Gruber-Lebowitz. These beautiful notecards and prints will be on sale periodically through 2018.
- The Coffeehouse Ministry Team and the Building Committee have engaged a broker to find the most effective partner to help run the coffeehouse and the architect is preparing conceptual renderings.
- To date, over \$682,000 has been received towards Mission Possible Phase II pledges. Thank you!

All of this could not have been possible without your steadfast commitment and generous financial gifts. Contributions to Mission Possible Phase II are always welcome and can be fulfilled over a three-year period. 2018 promises to be a very productive year for MP Phase II. With your continued prayers and gifts, we will fulfill Foundry's mission to expand our church's ministry, music and mission.

# Faith

## REMASTERED

**Remaster** - to make a new copy of a musical recording or film with the sound or image improved.

The master copy of a composition is the original version. Now, with the aid of technology, musical recordings and films can be remastered. Often the remastered versions reveal new depth, clarity and richness of color and tone. Remastering enlivens enjoyment of classics by those who have long cherished them and makes them available and accessible to new listeners and viewers.

This year at Foundry, we will play with the concept of remastering as we return to the classics of our faith tradition. We will examine the core teachings and tenets of Christian faith – stories from scripture, worship practices, theological concepts and dynamics of covenant relationship. The language of music and melody will weave throughout the year as we deepen and renew our living faith.
