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Mission Possible Update

Giving Back for Foundry's Future

Even in this time of anxiety and uncertainty, there is much at Foundry to feel good about. Near the top of that list is the success of Mission Possible, our multi-year effort to enhance our capability to extend radical hospitality to all. Thanks to your sacrifice, generosity and commitment, Foundry has received just over \$2 million of the \$2.5 million pledged for the project, which began in 2017.

With those funds, we have been able to:

- Fully renovate our sanctuary's historic Casavant pipe organ, enabling this extraordinary instrument to function at maximum capacity to further enhance Foundry's music ministry.
- Install new environmentally friendly air handlers in the sanctuary, making the space more comfortable throughout the year.
- Install new humidifiers in Community Commons.
- Refurbish the skylight over the Columbarium to better protect the space honoring deceased members of the Foundry family.
- Restore our handsome and historic exterior doors.
- Create a rain garden that will reduce the flow of stormwater into storm drains.
- Repay funds borrowed to finance the new main floor restrooms, reception area and Community Commons which so enhance our ability to welcome and connect with one another.

Another goal of Mission Possible II -establishing a coffeehouse to better connect with Foundry's surrounding community -- has been tabled in order to focus human and financial resources on other pressing issues, chief among them Foundry's leadership toward full inclusion of LGBTQ persons in the UMC.

I remember a time when I was feeling the weight of grief. My father was nearing the end of his life and other loved ones were also suffering. Furthermore, strife and injustice seemed to be exponentially increasing in the world. One day, taking a contemplative walk, I felt again the familiar ache of sadness, as though I was drowning, deep under water.

But, suddenly, something emerged from the deep, like an inner memory reel, flash after flash of faces, voices, and encounters that filled my heart with joy. It was a moment of pure grace. There is no way I could have consciously drawn up such a series of clear visions from across all the years of my life with such speed. The memories of tenderness, generosity, forgiveness, hilarity, friendship, loyalty, and love were overwhelming.

I realized then that I had begun to believe that the deepest well within me was the well of grief and despair for the world. But I was wrong. Ask God to reveal memories hidden to time, dwelling deep within you, a source of joy even in the midst of struggle and grief. You may make a daily practice of recording them in a journal or adding them to your home altar or worshipful space.

Experience teaches me that joy can break through tears as we remember where divine love has been made real in our lives. May it be so for you.

Tuning into Worship


