## Pieced Together by Grace

In a world that often feels as though it is fraying at the seams, it's easy to assume that division is simply the way things are. Polarization is normalized. Identity is flattened into labels. Faith is reduced to sentiment or abstraction.

Against all of this, the Church is called to witness to another way of being human.

In this season after Christmas, we proclaim that God has already chosen to dwell with us in Christ. The Word became flesh and moved into our world — not to float above our brokenness, but to enter it.

In Christ, God is patiently piecing together what has been torn apart. As the pieces come together, they reveal a humanity made whole. This is not wishful thinking. It is the heart of the gospel.

Our current sermon and worship series explores the "pieces" that shape our shared life: our theology and history, our commitment to justice, our values, and our vision for the future. These are not scattered fragments we must scramble to assemble on our own. They are elements of a Spirit-woven identity — gifts we receive, remember, and live into together. When we reclaim them, we offer a counter-testimony to a world shaped by thin platitudes, shallow spirituality, and systems that divide.



As a tangible expression of this shared identity, you'll find puzzle pieces available in the Community Commons throughout the season. You are invited to write your name, respond to a simple prompt, or decorate a piece in whatever way feels authentic to you. Each piece on its own is incomplete. Together, they will form a visible sign of how God's love and life are at work among us — holding us, shaping us, and piecing us together into a beloved community.

This is not about manufacturing unity. It is about acknowledging who we already are in Christ and allowing the Spirit to keep doing the slow, holy work of mending what is broken — for the healing of the world.
