The vision names four core priorities that will guide our ministry:


- Foundry must embody radical hospitality extending God's welcome in every space, every encounter, and every ministry. Invitation, hospitality, and caring for those who walk through our doors are at the heart of our call. We share our love of Christ and Foundry, trusting that people respond when invited.
- God created us for community. At Foundry there is a circle with your name on it — circles of learning, discipleship, care, justice, joy, and faith.
- Our ministries nurture the next generations in faith, provide relationships of care, and open doors for children and youth to serve in the church and wider world.
- Whether you are new to Foundry or a long-time member, you will find opportunities to serve — through direct aid that offers "strength for today" and through advocacy that advances "bright hope for tomorrow."

This vision is rooted in the belief that our vitality and sustainability depend upon three commitments: cultivating lay leadership, practicing faithful financial stewardship, and engaging in clear, creative communication that shares the good news within and beyond our walls.

Beloved, we need one another — and the world needs Foundry. May this vision guide us as we continue to offer strength for today and bright hope for tomorrow.

Foundry is a historic, progressive United Methodist Church that welcomes all, worships passionately, challenges the status quo, and seeks to transform the world through God's love. Deeply grounded in the traditions of our faith, we aim to be innovative in our efforts to be a place of positive change within Christianity, within our denomination, within ourselves, and in the world.

What We Do

At Foundry, our call is to deepen faith through transcendent worship and challenging study, to create engaged community through inclusiveness and caring, and to transform the world through active service and prophetic leadership.

Our Priorities

Over the next five years, the Foundry community will focus on four core priorities



Invitation, Hospitality, and Care

We will bring others into our community by sharing God's love and witnessing to the mission and ministry of Foundry. We will embody radical hospitality and provide a transcendent worship experience. We will care for all who encounter Foundry and walk alongside each other in times of celebration and challenge, joy and grief..



Children, Youth, and Their Families

Children and youth will explore their developing faith, build meaningful relationships, and find opportunities to serve their church and the wider world. We will support a growing number of children, youth and their families, engaging them fully in congregational life.



Communities of Learning, Care, Service, and Justice

We will help everyone at Foundry find their circle by expanding and supporting small groups, intellectually challenging classes, and opportunities for fellowship. These will be places where all can learn, grow, serve, and be in relationship with others.



Service and Social Justice

We will establish a Center for Social Justice that serves as a hub for service, direct aid to our neighbors, and advocacy opportunities to create the just world we seek. The Center will convene, learn from, teach, and equip other congregations to do this work.

Our Path Forward

Three commitments will inform and support how we pursue our priorities:

Lay Leadership Development

We will call, equip, send, and support the Foundry community as they envision and execute the vision for our congregation.


Everyone will have a community and a role that connects them to the wider congregation.

Financial Stewardship

We will ensure long-term financial stability by reducing our debt, expanding our financial reach, and caring for our building so that it continues to be a hub of the community's work.

Clear, Creative Communication

We will create systems of communication that make it easy to find new ways to serve and tell the story of Foundry to the wider world. As part of this work, we will focus on Foundry's internal data and communications systems.

Invitation, Hospitality, and Care

Foundry is a place of radical hospitality, transcendent worship, and engaged community.

Our call is to invite others along to experience the good news of God's love and justice, thereby growing disciples and changing lives through the Holy Spirit. Foundry cares for one another, creating an environment that welcomes all from the start and sees our community through all stages of life.


- Foundry members regularly share their faith and love of Foundry, inviting others to participate in worship, service, social events, and small groups.
- Every Foundry member is able to identify their role in the church, whether it be passing the plate, teaching a class, or serving on a ministry team.
- Foundry will continue to provide a worship experience that includes powerful music, challenging preaching, and prayerful support.
- Our physical space is visitor-friendly with welcoming signs, easy-to-access information about our ministries, and bright classrooms and spaces of fellowship.
- The Foundry Care Team and Stephens Ministry leaders are larger in numbers and will provide support in many forms, including the listening ear, prayer, visitation, meals and coordination of other resources.
- An Establishing Connection Ministry Team
 continues to develop new ways for Foundry to
 be a welcoming congregation and deepen the
 connection among the people of Foundry and
 its community.





Foundry is a big church that thrives on small communities. Everyone is invited to find their circle at Foundry: circles of learning, caring, justice, joy, and faith. Foundry groups, classes, and small groups are places where all can **learn, grow, fellowship**, and be in relationship with others.

- We offer an increasing diversity of gatherings that include small groups, intellectually challenging classes, and opportunities for fellowship.
- More members are engaged in at least one circle and explore new options as their lives, interests, and spiritual needs change.
- Online programming allows community
 members to see all available groups and
 express interest in joining easily. New offerings
 are added to respond to member interests and
 inspirations.
- A Small Groups Support Team engages a large, diverse group of lay leaders to suggest new ideas, support new members, and ensure there are always circles available to meet the community's needs. These leaders are supported with training, resources, and care to ensure their commitment is meaningful and valued.
- We foster a culture of transformation, sharing testimonials and celebrating milestones within the groups.



Family Ministries is a visible, vibrant, and valued cornerstone of life at Foundry that allows children and youth the space to **explore their developing faith** and supports families through all stages of life. We will support a growing number of children, youth and their families, engaging them fully in congregational life.

- Children and youth are increasingly visible,
 vital participants in service and mission-work,
 educational opportunities like Sunday School,
 and worship. They serve in leadership roles
 alongside adults and have a voice in the
 ministries of the church.
- Milestones for children and youth are an established tradition in the life of Foundry including Baptism, receiving a Bible in 3rd grade, confirmation, graduation, and the college/post-high school cookie ministry.
- Families are supported along the way, including through tough and challenging seasons, as they seek **fellowship and support** from other Foundry members invested in the lives of their children.
- A larger, more robust, **intergenerational team of lay leaders**, parents and non-parents alike, lead the activities that help children and youth feel safe, connected, and beloved.
- Physical spaces at Foundry readily make room for children and families with bright, engaging signs, age-appropriate furniture and materials, and easy-to-find information on how to engage with opportunities for children and youth.





Service and Social Justice

At Foundry, social justice and demonstrating God's love for the world are central to our experience together. Our community offers opportunities for **service and direct aid** that provide immediate, life-affirming help for those in need, as well as **advocacy opportunities** to create the just, peaceful, and loving world we seek.

- A newly-establishised Center for Social Justice serves as a hub for service, direct aid, and advocacy work. The Center will provide opportunities to convene, learn from, teach, and equip congregations already engaged in this work and those who are just beginning.
- Advocacy campaigns continue to be a force for change in our city, nation, and world, empowering the Foundry community to speak out in the name of mercy and justice.
- Significant educational opportunities are offered, both for members of the Foundry community and for other churches, movements, and organizations to learn about our integrated approach to advocacy and direct aid.
- We support the important work of the Religion and Racial Justice Committee and a increasing number of people are engaged.
- We use Foundry's voice in our church, on the street, and online to share God's vision for service and social justice and lifting up the prophetic voice of our Senior Pastor and other Foundry leaders.



How We Got Here

Foundry's strategic vision is the result of two years of small group meetings, working groups focused on our key priorities, deep engagement by the Foundry Board, and the work of over 100 members of the Foundry community. We are grateful for all whose insights impacted this vision.
