

Friends,

As we see signs of hope spring up around us, we would like to provide you with an update regarding Foundry's plan to gradually return to in-person activities and services. While we are receiving guidance from local leaders and health officials, it is important to us that you be a part of this process.

The Foundry Board, with guidance from the existing science- and public health-focused Re-Entry Ministry Team, has worked with staff to set target dates for a phased return to regular, in-person, indoor events and services in our building on 16th Street. These dates are as follows:

- June 1, 2021: Staff will begin returning to the building for work.
- July 15, 2021: Ministry teams and small groups, working with staff, will begin meeting in the building.
- Sept. 5, 2021: The latest possible date we will resume full-capacity in-person Sunday worship services. Smaller in-person worship services may resume prior to Sept. 5 and other in-person events are scheduled throughout the summer.

The newly formed Re-Entry Implementation Task Force will be working with staff and lay leadership to meet these target dates set by the Board in a way that is deliberate, thoughtful, and sensitive to your concerns.

To help us better understand your thoughts on the return to in-person Sunday worship and other activities at Foundry, we are asking that you complete our Congregational Survey by Friday, June 4.
