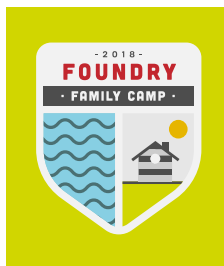

We are intellectually honest and curious. We view science, scholarship and other religious traditions as tools to discover the wonder of God's Word and creation.

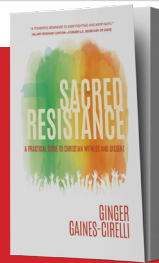
WE CHERISH GOD'S GIFTS
