When we gather for worship and ministry on the corner of 16th and P, we do so upon the sacred, traditional, and unceded lands of the Anacostan, Massawomack, Susquehanock, Piscataway, and Pomunkey peoples, who were forcibly removed from them to allow for English settlement. As occupiers of their territory, we recognize them as the original and perpetual stewards of this land and gratefully acknowledge our responsibility for a more honest recounting of our history that empowers us to work for the thriving of all people.

WELCOME GUEST PREACHER: REV. MICHAEL SZPAK

Reverend Doctor Michael Szpak is a retired member of the Baltimore-Washington Conference, having been appointed to a ministry beyond the local church with the national AFL-CIO for twenty-five years until his retirement. He currently serves as Religion-Labor Coordinator of the AFL-CIO in Washington, DC. He coordinates the AFL-CIO Labor in the Pulpit, Bimah, Minbar program which is an initiative to develop relationships between labor and faith congregations in local communities. Foundry United Methodist Church is his Charge Conference.

Reverend Szpak became active in the labor movement working on the United Farm Workers of America boycott of California grapes as an undergraduate at Boston College. Also the civil rights movement, having traveled to Selma, Alabama, responding to the country wide call from Rev. Dr Martin Luther King Jr. to engage in freedom protests there.


Michael was the founding executive director of the Carolina Brown Lung Association, which obtained the first compensation benefits for textile workers in North and South Carolina who suffered from brown lung, a disabling illness from breathing cotton dust similar to black lung disease contracted by coal miners.

Michael has worked on various union strikes, lockouts, boycotts and organizing campaigns such as the United Mineworker of America's Brookside Mine strike in Harlan County, Kentucky; the textile workers union boycott of the JP Stevens company which denied union representation to thousands of textile workers in the South; and efforts by the Farm Labor Organizing Committee (FLOC) to bring justice to farm workers in the fields of North Carolina and the South. In all of these, the faith community has played a significant role.

Reverend Szpak is a member and former officer of the Baltimore-Washington Newspaper Guild Local 32025.

Michael holds a Master of Divinity and Doctor of Ministry from Wesley Theological Seminary; a Master of Education from Boston State College; and a Master of Social Work from the University of Connecticut. His undergraduate degree is from Boston College.


